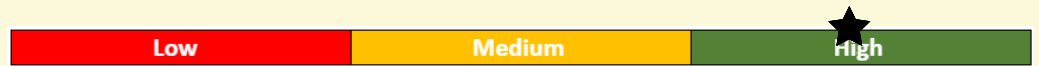


# ELECTED OFFICIAL'S IMPACT REPORT
